SECTION 4. FIRST AID MEASURES

Description of first aid measures:

In case of inhalation: If inhaled, remove to fresh air. If not breathing, give artificial respiration. If breathing is difficult, give oxygen. Get medical attention if irritation occurs.

In case of skin contact: In case of contact, immediately flush skin with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes while removing contaminated clothing and shoes. Wash clothing before reuse. Thoroughly clean shoes before reuse. Get medical attention if irritation occurs.

In case of eye contact: Check for and remove any contact lenses. In case of contact, immediately flush eyes with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes. Cold water may be used. Get medical attention if irritation occurs.

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In case of ingestion Do NOT induce vomiting unless directed to do so by medical personnel. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Loosen tight clothing such as a collar, tie, belt or waistband. Get medical attention if symptoms occur.

Most important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed:

Inhalation: May cause respiratory irritation.

Ingestions: Ingestion may cause irritation to mouth, throat and stomach. Large doses may lead to ulceration of GI tract.

Skin contact: Causes skin irritation.

Eye contact: Causes serious eye irritation.

Indication of any immediate medical attention and special treatment needed:

During fires and high temperatures metal fume fever may result from the inhalation of magnesium oxide fumes if magnesium oxide. Symptoms of metal fume fever include chills, fever, headache, coughing, weakness, dryness of nose and mouth, muscular pain, and vomiting. Symptoms of metal fume fever occur about 4 to 12 hours after exposure and usually last about 24 hours.

SECTION 5. FIRE -FIGHTING MEASURE

SMALL FIRE: Use dry chemical powder.

Generates toxic fumes of magnesium oxide above 1200 °C.

SECTION 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE

Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures:

For non-emergency personnel: Splash goggles, gloves and respiratory equipment, be sure to use an approved/certified respirator or equivalent.

For emergency responders: Splash goggles, gloves and respiratory equipment, be sure to use an approved/certified respirator or equivalent.

Environmental precautions:

Stop leak if without risk. Do not touch spilled material. Prevent entry into sewers, basements or confined areas; dike if needed. Call for assistance on disposal.

Methods for containment and cleaning up:

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For small spills Contain spilled material if possible. Collect in suitable and properly labelled containers. Absorb with materials such as: sand, earth, vermiculite or diatomaceous earth.

For large spills Prevent entry into sewers, water courses, basements or confined areas. Wash spillages into an effluent treatment plant or proceed as follows. Contain and collect spillage with non-combustible, absorbent material e.g. sand, earth, vermiculite or diatomaceous earth and place in well labelled container for disposal according to local regulations.

SECTION 7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

Precautions for safe handling:
